This is a short, trouble-free opening hole. A drive down right center gives the best angle for approach.



Avoid the fairway bunker off the tee. Your second shot should be aimed down the left side of the fairway to yield the best angle for approach.

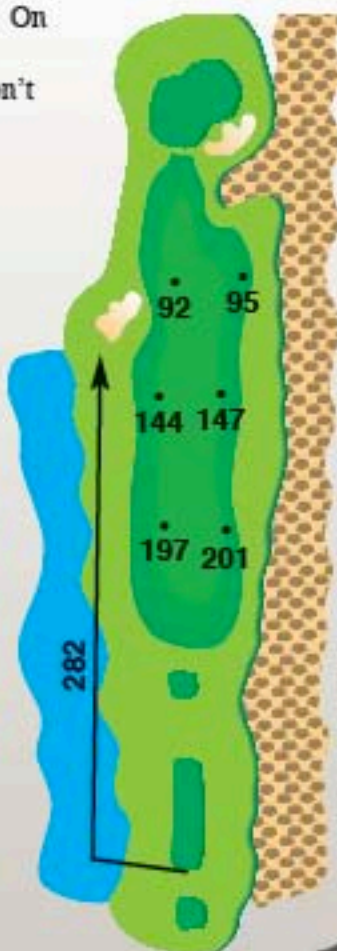

Deceptive driving hole, trouble lurks both right and left. On your approach take into account elevation and don't leave your shot short.



Pin placement should be taken into account on this deep green. Be aware of the bunkers both left and right.

This hole requires accuracy off the tee box. Avoid the trouble, and you may have the option of reaching in two. If not, your approach should favor the right side of the fairway. Be aware of the tree in front of the green.

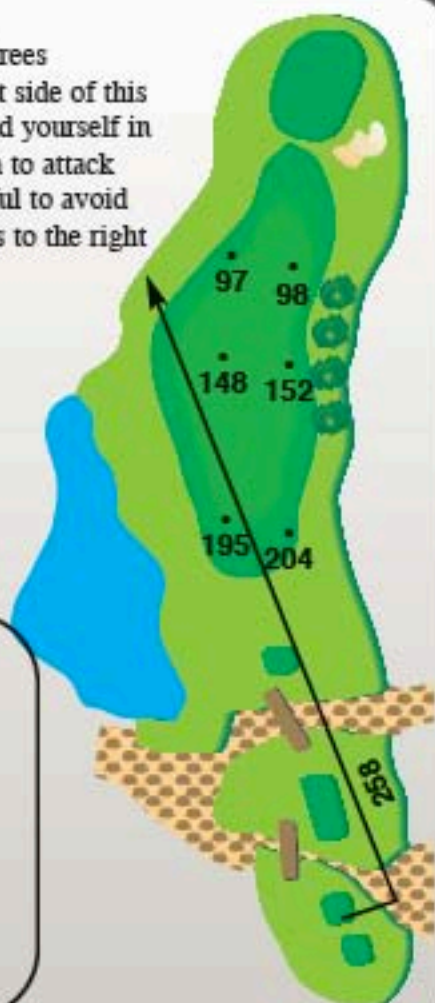


If you avoid the trees guarding the right side of this hole, you will find yourself in excellent position to attack the pin. Be careful to avoid two large bunkers to the right of the green.

A long and difficult par 4 closes the front nine. Keep the tee shot down left center to avoid hitting into the meandering creek. The creek and a large bunker come into play on your approach.

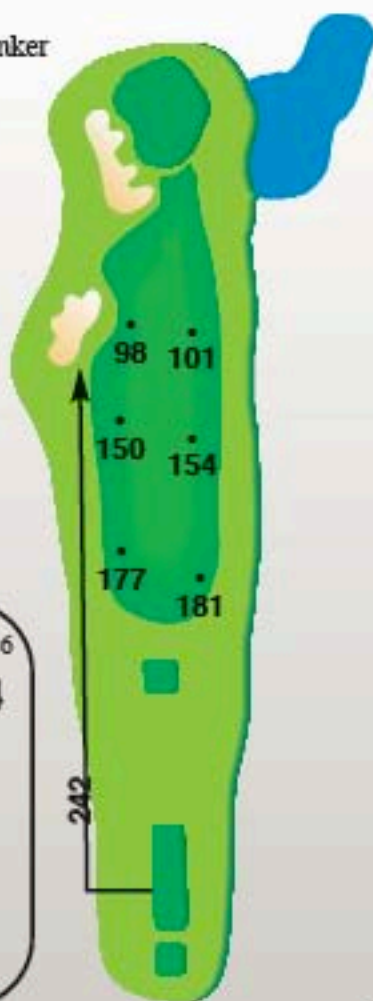

This is a very reachable par 5. Keep the drive away from the massive tree, and a long iron or fairway wood can be used to hit into this green. Three very dangerous bunkers guard this deep and narrow green.

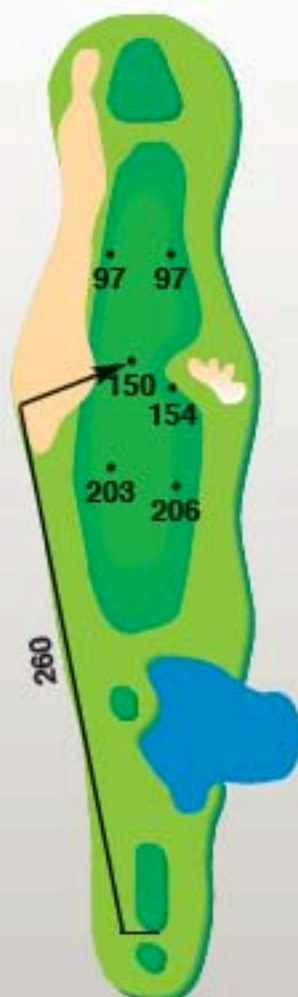

This could be the tightest hole on the course, which makes for intimidating tee shot. Keep your drive between the bunkers for the best look into this tough par 4.

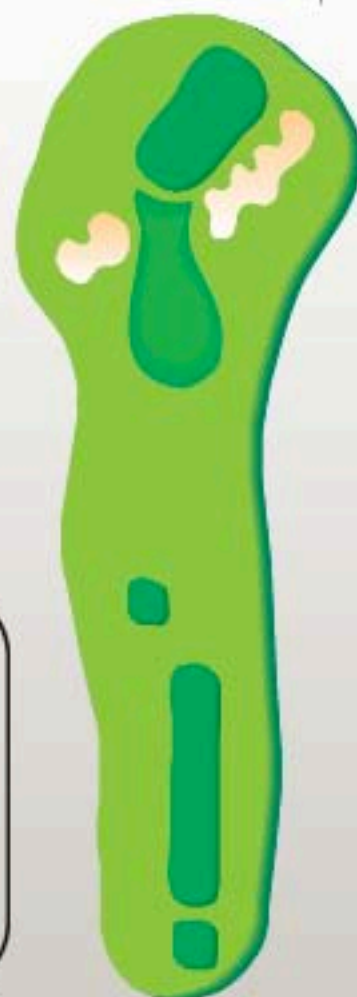

Trust the yardage. It is longer than it appears. Beware of the bunker guarding the back left side of this green. A short approach can lead

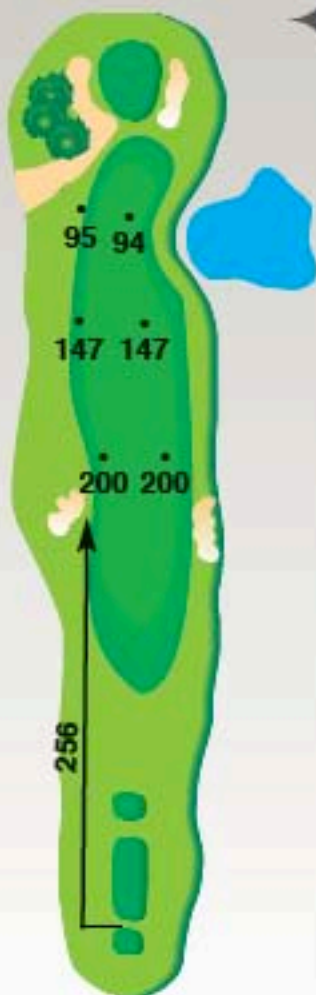

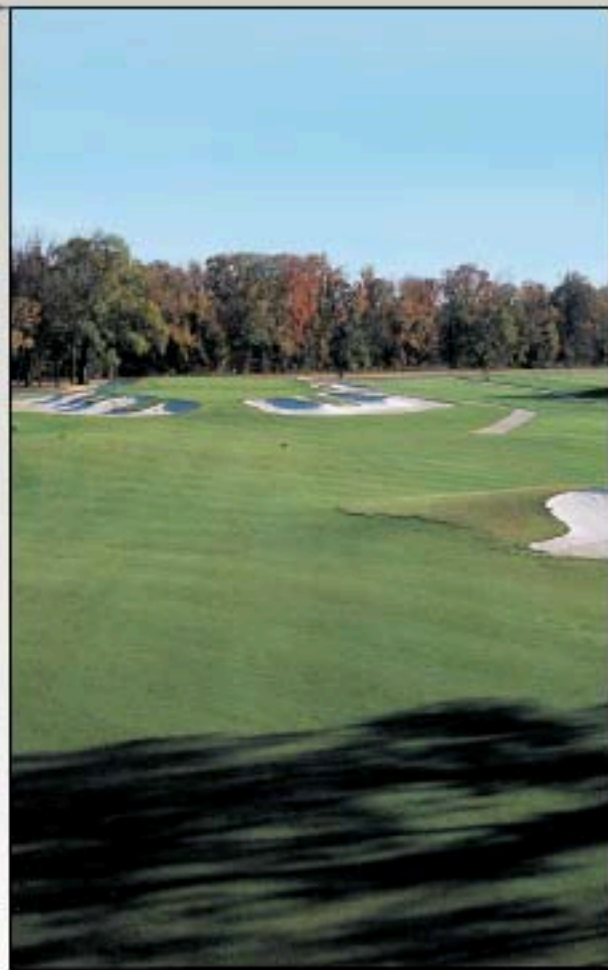
Another reachable par 5. If laying up, avoid the hazard just on the right side of the fairway and be aware of the trees guarding the left side of the green.
